BEGLOBAL TRAINING IN CHILE

Recently, a meeting took place at the **Chillán** campus of the Universidad Católica de la Santísima Concepción, where the Chilean teams involved in the project strengthened their relationships and devised strategies to address local challenges in future training programs for young people. This meeting reinforces BeGlobal's commitment to promoting inclusive education.
